WHAT IS ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE?

Administration of Justice is a specialization within Criminal Studies that focuses on how laws and law enforcement relate to the criminal justice system. Administration of justice typically covers criminology, ethics and crime control and law topics. This can include looking at local, state, and federal law enforcement, security, courtroom operations, and the juvenile procedure system, as well as other aspects of criminal law. An administration of justice degree includes careers in forensics or law, but these normally require further education at the master's or doctoral level.

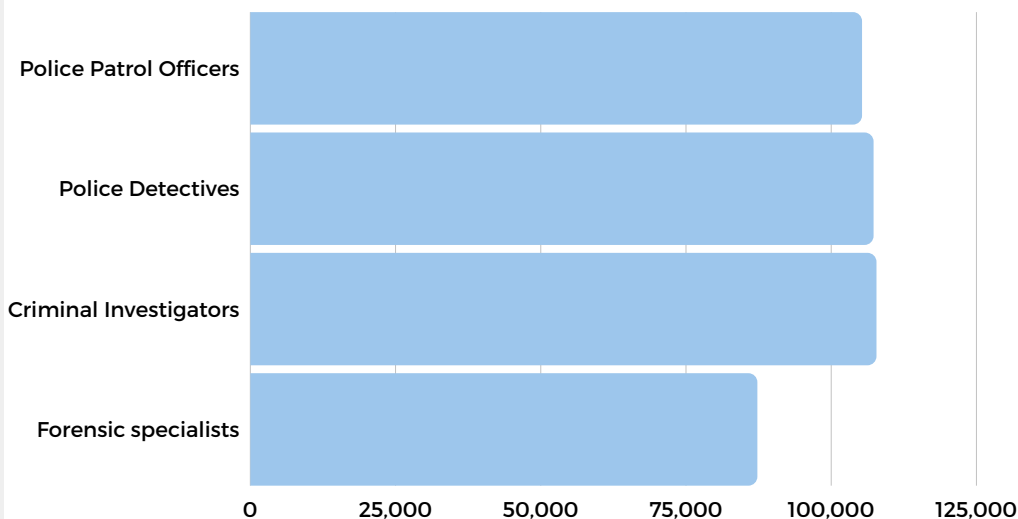
